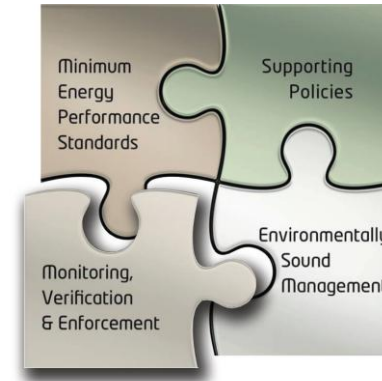

# *lites.asia* - Background

7

- Inception - Hong Kong October 2009, representatives from Australia, China, India, Indonesia, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Thailand, USA and Vietnam met to discuss the potential benefits of regional co-operation on the development of lighting standards.
- Developed a ten point plan which in essence was about:
  - Improving knowledge of standards in force and under development across the region;
  - Increasing participation of regional economies in the IEC standards development process to ensure resulting test methods and performance standards are appropriate to the region;
  - The development of national and regional capacity for compliance in standards and labeling processes.

# ***lites.asia*** Background

- Between 2009 and 2011, lites.asia was supported by US Aid funded ECO-Asia and the Australian Government
- From late 2011-14, the Australian Government has supported lites.asia through AusAID Fast Start funding
- Now lites.asia managed by UNEP en.lighten as part of regional project with Australian support
- In-kind support has also been received from the many participants in lites.asia meetings and projects
- Regional meetings have enabled participants to share experiences in working to achieve improved lighting efficiency and quality; learn more about international standards development; and hear from experts on lighting topics

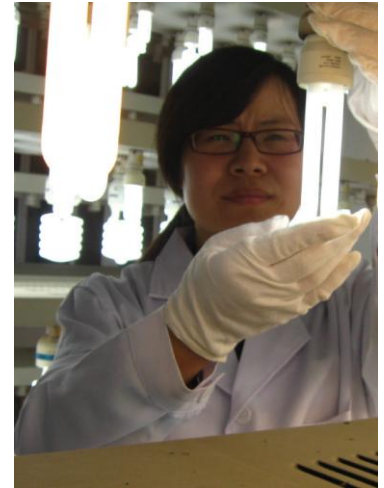
