- Inception Hong Kong October 2009, representatives from Australia, China, India, Indonesia, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Thailand, USA and Vietnam met to discuss the potential benefits of regional co-operation on the development of lighting standards.

Developed a ten point plan which in essence was about:

- Improving knowledge of standards in force and under development across the region;
- Increasing participation of regional economies in the IEC standards development process to ensure resulting test methods and performance standards are appropriate to the region;
- The development of national and regional capacity for compliance in standards and labeling processes.
